

Let Light Shine Out of Darkness: The Campaign for St. George's College



"For God, who said 'Let light shine out of darkness' made his light shine in our hearts" (2 Corinthians 4:6)



This is an appeal to all who know and value the work of St George's College, Jerusalem, including those whose faith and ministry have been inspired and encouraged by pilgrimages based there, and to all who value the ministry of hope and reconciliation that the college represents, especially in the present dark days of violence, fear and isolation.

Since its founding in 1920 as a theological college for Palestinian seminarians and its redevelopment in the 1960s as a centre for formation and reconciliation for clergy and laity from the worldwide Anglican Communion and beyond, St George's College, Jerusalem has worked and witnessed through times of relative stability and times of political and armed crisis in and around the Holy Land.

The warfare that has intensified in the Middle East since October 2023 has had a devastating impact on the ministry of the Diocese of Jerusalem. Archbishop Hosam Naoum has said "my diocese is bleeding at this time" and he has appealed to Anglicans from around the world to offer prayers and practical support.

Never before has a crisis so existentially challenged St George's College as the present one.

Yet never before – either – has a crisis presented such an opportunity to ensure the College's thriving until the Lord returns.

Let Light Shine out of Darkness is the title of an international appeal to friends of St George's across the globe that aims to raise **£1 million**, in the first instance to ensure the College's survival through the present crisis and – beyond that – to strengthen its core finances to ensure a thriving future for the College.

The **British Regional Committee** has the objective of raising at least **£100,000** towards this total.


The Present Crisis

Violence and uncertainty have created a major crisis for St George's College. The annual budget of the College is primarily supported through earned revenue from pilgrims' fees, gift shop sales, and other lodging fees. This revenue stream has been totally disrupted. It is highly unlikely that pilgrimages will resume in the next twelve months and there are insufficient funds to provide already-reduced salaries for the College's staff and essential operations in 2025.

The situation is dire for the staff and their families, and for the future of the College itself.

During this time of alarming tension and restrictions, the College has adapted with creativity and resilience. The Dean and remaining staff have produced videos for virtual pilgrimages, developed future curricula, and maintained the facility.

The British Regional Committee maintains close contact with the College's Dean, the Very Reverend Canon Richard Sewell, and with Archbishop Hosam, who are both deeply dedicated and committed to the College. We join in solidarity with them to help St George's College in its time of need.



How To Give

This appeal is going out to approximately *** UK based friends of St George's, including some 125 who have taken part over the last ten years on a Jerusalem Formation Course as ordinands or recently ordained clergy. A donation of between £100 and £200 from each recipient would enable us to reach (and exceed) our target. If you are a UK taxpayer, please ensure that your contribution is Gift Aided so as to maximize its value.


